EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

The purpose of the Agricultural Awareness Program is to educate grade school students about food and where it comes from. The Program has a number of presenters who give a 10 to 15 minute presentation to the students on their specific topic.

All display will be located in the Agriculture Awareness Building

Drop off times for exhibits are Wednesday, Sept 13th from 6 - 8:30pm, and Thursday, Sept 14th from 7 - 8:30am with tags attached. A \$10 exhibitor fee must be included with registration unless deducted from last year's prize money.

The Richmond Agricultural Society will not be responsible for loss or damage to entries

Exhibitors with identification are able to pick up their work from committee members at 5:00 - 6:00 pm, Sunday, September 17th

Note: Prize money will be mailed out after the Fair. No exhibitor will be allowed to make more than one entry in any one section

Section 40 - Scarecrow

Prizes: 1st: \$50, 2nd: \$35, 3rd: \$20, 4th: \$10, 5th: \$10, 6th: \$10

Classes:

1. Scarecrow

Only one entry per exhibitor, contest open to individuals, families or groups

Entries will be judged according to originality

Entry will consist of 1 or 2 figures (i.e. pair of scarecrows together as one entry)

Scarecrows may be mounted on a stick or seated. If seated, exhibitor must supply own seating.

Do not put valuable accessories on your entry

Entries will be judged by length of gourd
Gourd must be grown by exhibitor

4H Regular: PRIZES: 1st \$5, 2nd \$3, 3rd \$2

1. Chocolate 4H Brownies, not iced, 3 on a paper plate inside a Ziplock bag. Pieces approximately 2" x 2". Use the Chocolate 4H Brownies recipe below.
2. Display of 3 garden vegetables on a tray, ALL NAMED, grown by you.
3. A 4" x 6" (glossy or matte finish) photograph collection (minimum four, maximum eight) of You depicting 'Learn to Do by Doing', mounted on Bristol board. Must include the current Canadian 4H emblem, minimum size 2" x 2".

4H Field Crop Members: PRIZES: 1st \$10, 2nd \$6, 3rd \$4

4. Open to **4H Field crop members**...a sample of grain (barley, oats, spring/winter wheat, or beans (any variety) – 3lb displayed in a large or extra-large Ziplock bag and properly labelled.

Hay – 1 four-inch flake of machine baled (not from a round bale) cut hay...displayed in a supplied bag and properly labelled.

5. First cut alfalfa – 85% or more alfalfa
6. First cut legume other than alfalfa – 85% or more legume
7. First cut legume and grass – 70% and 30% either way
8. First cut grass – 85% or more grass
9. Second cut alfalfa or another legume – 85% or more legume
10. Second cut mixed legume and grass – 70% and 30% either way

Chocolate 4H Brownies

250ml (1 cup) butter
500ml (2 cups) sugar
4 eggs
425ml (1½ cups) flour
5ml (1 tsp) baking powder
2ml (½ tsp) salt
175ml (¾ cup) cocoa
10ml (2 tsp) vanilla

Preheat oven to 175°Celsius (350° Fahrenheit)

Melt butter. Stir in sugar, then eggs.

Sift and add flour, baking powder, salt and cocoa. Mix in vanilla.

Bake for 30 minutes in a greased 22x33cm (9 x 13inch) pan.
